Dear Seniors,

Before you know it, it will be fall and time for our annual Medicare Open enrollment which begins October 15 until December 7. This is your opportunity to review your Medicare Part D plan or your Medicare Advantage plan. If you feel your supplement costs are too high, you may want to consider a Medicare Advantage plan with prescription drug coverage.

This year we will again have a schedule available, after September 23<sup>rd</sup>, where you can sign up for an appointment with one of our S.H.I.P. Counselors. This is by appointment only, so please sign up. Please bring a full list of your medications and dosages to your appointment.

If you are struggling with high drug costs, Social Security has a program called Extra Help. To qualify your annual income is limited to \$18,735 for an individual or \$25,365 for a married couple. Your assets are limited to \$14,390 for an individual or \$28,720 for a married couple, not counting your home, car or any life insurance policy as an asset. We would be happy to assist you to see if you qualify.

If anyone is interested in becoming a S.H.I.P. Counselor please see Karen. The hours are very flexible and it not only benefits our seniors but helps the counselors understand Medicare better.

**Emergency Assistance Program-** Guidelines have recently increased, you may refer to the following table to see if you or someone you know qualifies for financial assistance for gas, electric, water and rent. Please keep in mind that there are additional qualifying factors to our programs besides income.

**Low Income Home Energy Assistance-** LIHEAP assists low-income households by offsetting the rising cost of home energy through direct financial assistance. An overdue bill or disconnect notice is not required. You may call our office for eligibility requirements and to set up an appointment based on the following priority periods. LIHEAP starts October 1, 2019.

**Priority Period 1 (Oct. 1):** Households with a senior member age 60+ or households with a person receiving Social Security Disability Benefits.

**Priority Period 2 (Nov. 1):** Households with one or more disconnected utilities, or under imminent threat of disconnection from their gas and/or electricity source, or households with children age 5 and under.

**Regular Application Period (Dec. 1):** Available program benefits open to all eligible low-income households of Wayne Township.

### 2019 General Assessment

My staff and I plan to complete the 2019 General Assessment by the end of September. Assessment notices will then be mailed to all property owners in October. The General Assessment year occurs every four years, and all neighborhoods are reviewed and adjusted to improve assessment uniformity and to achieve a median level of assessments close to 33 1/3% (one-third) of market value within each neighborhood.

After the notices are mailed and the assessments are published in the Examiner newspapers, property owners will have 30 days to file assessment appeals. Assessment appeals may be based on either market value or assessment uniformity. An appeal based on market value is appropriate when the owner believes that the assessed value, multiplied by three, exceeds the fair market value of his/her property as of January 1, 2019, based on sales that occurred between 2016 and 2018. An appeal based on assessment uniformity is appropriate when the owner believes that his/her property is assessed differently than other, similar properties. Property assessment and sales data are available on our website. My staff will be glad to discuss your assessment with you after you receive your General Assessment Notice.

### Senior Citizens Homestead Exemption New Renewal Procedure

This year the DuPage County Supervisor of Assessments (SA) has changed its procedures for handing the renewal of the Senior Citizens Homestead Exemption. For most recipients this exemption will be automatically renewed. The SA's office mailed status forms to exemption recipients in May. Due to the new procedure, those forms only need to be returned if there was a change in ownership or residency status of the property.

### Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze Exemption

This exemption is available to Senior Citizens 65 and

older during 2019, who owned and occupied the home on January 1, 2018, and on January 1, 2019, with total 2018 household income of \$65,000 or less. My staff will be happy to assist you with your application. When you visit my office, please bring your 2018 SSA 1099 and US 1040 Forms. To ensure timely processing of this exemption, please apply by the October 1, 2019, deadline.
