Hello Members!

I know that a lot of you have been anxious for us to re-open and that time has now come! We are having a "soft opening" as of October 1st. We are slowly introducing INDOOR daily activities at the Center! With that being said, there are several safety precautions that we as staff and all of you as members must do. Each person who enters the building must wear a mask, over the nose, at all times. If you are not able to wear it over the nose then we ask that you do not attend events. Each person will be screened upon arrival with a temperature check and a daily screening form must be filled out and signed. The center doors will open 15 minutes prior to each event, no earlier. All chairs, tables, and door handles will be sanitized with Benefect before and after each event. Bathrooms are available to be used at your own discretion and will be sanitized after each event. We installed 4 touchless hand sanitizers that should be used prior to entering the Center. At the end of each event, we ask that you do not stay to socialize. We must get everyone out so we can sanitize and prepared for our next group. There will be no back to back groups at this time.

Our lunch events will have no more than 50 people and we will continue to serve in individual containers. We are not able to offer coffee or snacks on a daily basis and members are not able to use the community refrigerator, water dispenser, or kitchen area.

Our small group events will be limited to 20 people or less with seating of 4 people at our large, round tables.

We want all of you to feel welcome while here but we must remain diligent about everyone's safety. If masks are not worn properly or if someone has a temperature over 100 degrees, you will not be able to be in our Senior Center.
