Reminder About Updated Volunteer Policy

New Guest Policy

We implemented a new guest policy for 2024.

- 1. All guests must be a guest of a current SC member.
- 2. Each member can have a limited number of guests.
- 3. Guests can sign up for events two weeks after its release date.
- 4. Guest prices for in-house events will be an additional \$5 per guest.
- 5. Guest prices for day bus trips will be an additional \$15 per guest.
- 6. Guest prices for overnight trips will be an additional \$30 per guest.


As always, you must schedule your ride in advance, with staff. Availability is not guaranteed.
