Hello Residents of Wayne Township,

2022 was a successful year for Wayne Township as we

saw our attendance rise as the year went on. We have received \$1.2 million in ARPA funds that will help us continue our growth. As the weather gets warmer, we will be constructing an addition to our Senior Center. Our programs are growing and we have worked out an agreement with Winfield Township to allow their seniors to

Township to allow their seniors to attend. The extra space will come in handy as we welcome our new

guests. We will be adding an outdoor receiving area with storage for our food pantry. We are busting at the seams so this addition will bring added room for dry goods storage and will have a small office for setting up residents as they come for food distribution. This has been a request from the Food Pantry as they see their numbers continue to grow. Also for the Food Pantry, a generator is being acquired to make sure the food doesn't spoil in case of a power outage.

Our outdoor park area will finish stage 2. Gazebos, paths, and outdoor seating will be put in place. This will allow our seniors and our youth program to utilize these once overgrown areas. Activities that will be added are bocci, shuffleboard, horseshoes, and a butterfly garden. We will also be adding to our community garden which grows vegetables for home use and the food pantry.

Our cemetery will finally get a paved parking area. Last year we added the paved path so with this the area should be in good shape for year-round service. There are plenty of plots available so please check our website for more information.

We welcome your suggestions to help improve our services to you. The township fills those gaps that the county or municipality does not handle. We continue to add programs and services as the need arises. Our offices are your resource to various programs offered through the

The Wayne Township Food Pantry is open every Wednesday from 10am-12pm for quick and easy drive-thru distributions. The line opens at 9:30am and closes at 11:45am.

Diaper distribution is available on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month, based on available inventory.

Senior Walk-Up Market Client Choice Pantry is available to seniors every Wednesday from 12:30-1:30pm. The walk-up market line does not start until 12:15pm. To avoid parking lot disruptions, please do not line up before then.

Upcoming Projects

Online Market: A new program in progress where participants will be able to create an account and place weekly orders for food from our inventory. Information will be posted on the township's website, stay tuned.

Drive-Up Services: A new annex building will be available to residents of Wayne Township to drive-up and apply for various services. This building is being funded through a grant that will allow low-mobility residents, parents with young children. etc., to apply for services without leaving their vehicle. Services will be available by appointment only. Information will be posted on the township's website, stay tuned.

Project Backpack: As kids and parents are looking forward to the end of the school year, we are busy planning for our next school supply distribution in August. Call us in July if you feel you will need help with backpacks or school supplies for your kids.

2023 General Assessment

My staff and I are working on the 2023 General Assessment, which occurs every four years. Each neighborhood will be reviewed, and assessments will be adjusted to improve uniformity and to bring the median level of assessments closer to 33^{1/3}% of the market value. After the General Assessment is completed, the assessment roll will be published in the Examiner newspapers. All property owners will receive General Assessment notices and will have 30 days from the date of publication to file assessment appeals. To appeal your assessment, you must provide evidence to prove your assessment exceeds 331/3% of its fair market value as of January 1, 2023, based on recent sales of similar properties, or provide evidence that your home is not assessed uniformly with similar properties in your neighborhood. Assessments and sales information is available at www.waynetowshipassessor.com.

As the Assessor it is my duty to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of the tax burden by conducting an accurate massappraisal of all properties in the township. The burden itself is the result of the levies of various taxing bodies, such as school districts, villages, park districts, libraries, and fire districts.

The Low-Income Senior Assessment Freeze Homestead **Exemption** had the words "Low-Income" added to the title by the IL Legislature. This exemption is available to seniors who are 65⁺ in 2023, who owned and occupied the property on January 1, 2022 and January 1, 2023, with a total household income of \$65,000 or less. Previous recipients of this exemption will be mailed an application to re-apply in May. New applicants can pick up an application at my office or call to schedule an appointment to complete your application. My staff is available to review your property record and assessments with you. The deadline to apply for this exemption is October 1, 2023.
